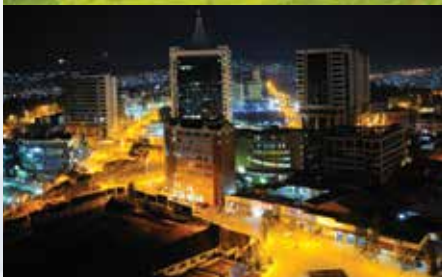

The Kigali Convention Centre (KCC), positioned on a hilltop in the heart of Kigali, was opened in 2016 and has already hosted numerous prestigious meetings including the 27th African Union Summit. The translucent dome is modelled on a traditional King's palace and contains multi-functional halls with a capacity of 2,600.

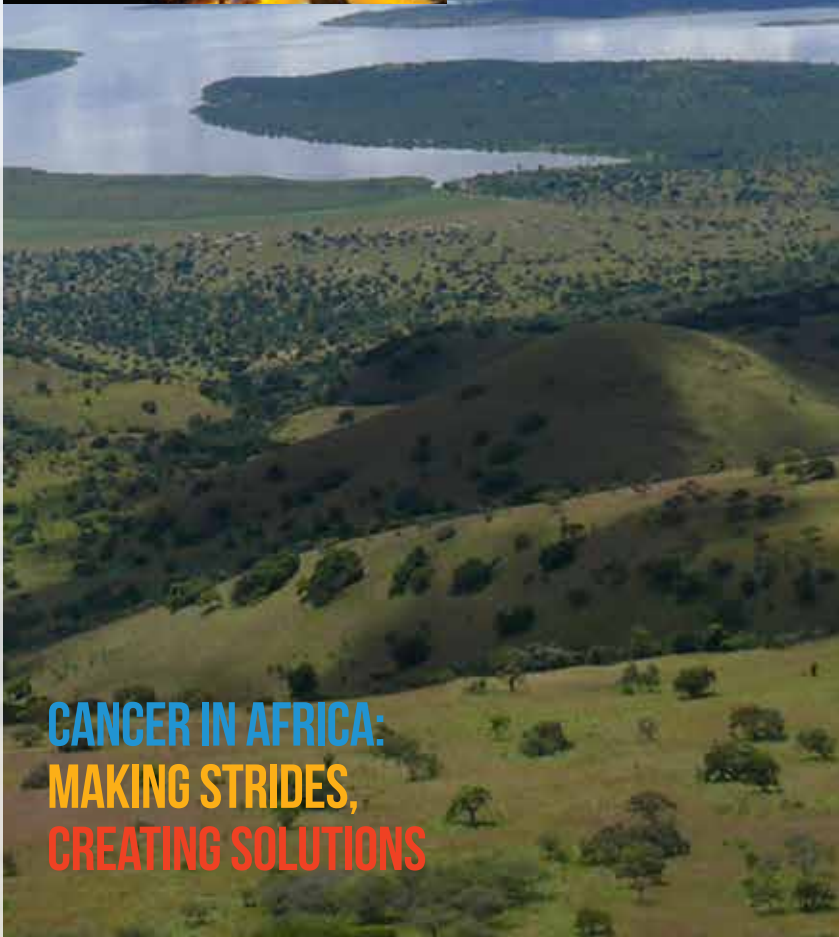
The 11th AORTIC International Conference on Cancer in Africa will welcome participants from around the globe.

CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

GUIDELINES

Abstracts should be relevant to healthcare and social issues specific to cancer and cancer control in Africa. Abstracts must adequately describe the research performed to allow reviewers to evaluate the quality, originality and thoroughness of the work.

ABSTRACT SPECIFICATIONS

- Abstracts may be submitted in English or French.
- Abstract title should be typed in UPPER CASE. The title should define the topic and contain no abbreviations.
- In the body of the abstract, standard abbreviations need not be defined; other abbreviations and acronyms should be defined on first use.
- Generic names for pharmaceuticals, biologicals and medical devices should be used in place of trade names. Trade names should only be used if equivalent products from multiple manufacturers are being compared.
- Overly commercial abstracts will not be accepted.
- Do not include graphics, photographs or tables.
- Maximum word count for the body of the abstract is 400 words.
- Submissions may have up to six authors (three presenting authors).
- The submitting author's name should appear first. All correspondence will be sent to the submitting author.
- The submitting author must be one of the presenting authors.

PRESENTATION FORMAT

An accepted abstract will be presented orally or as a poster. Oral abstracts will be grouped by topic and presented in the Free Communication of Abstracts sessions. Presenters will have eight minutes for presentation followed by two minutes for discussion.

Authors chosen for a poster session will be given two days to display their poster, with a dedicated poster session.

While effort will be made to accommodate author's preference in presentation format (oral or poster), the final decision will rest with the Scientific Programme Committee.

All accepted abstracts will be published in the electronic conference proceedings under the submitting author's name.

HOW TO SUBMIT AN ABSTRACT

- Prepare your abstract to the above specifications.
- Submit it electronically via the abstract submission site on the conference website
- Carefully check your details and abstracts, as it will be published "as is" with no further editing by the Programme Secretariat or Committee.
